

# Trauma and Aggression in Girls

Although boys continue to outnumber girls as the perpetrators of serious violent crime, over the past decade violent crime and aggressive behaviour among girls in Canada has increased at twice the rate observed for boys. Similar trends are apparent in other countries, such as the US, UK and Australia. This talk presents an overview of research activities of our CIHR NET program on girls and aggression. Recent trends in girls' aggression are summarized and research on the role of trauma is described. An attachment based model of aggressive behaviour is reviewed and intervention strategies are discussed.
